The best method of controlling an outbreak of head lice in school is by regularly checking your child's hair at home. If you find the presence of lice or nits, **TREAT IMMEDIATELY!!!**

Nit removal is *extremely* important. The lice shampoo does not kill all the nits. A warm vinegar rinse and hair dryer on the hottest setting will help loosen and kill the nits, but you must spend time pulling the nits from the hair with your fingernails or a good lice comb.

A good children's book interests the children who read it and makes them want to read more. Some such books appear regularly on lists of recommended children's reading. These are the books that appeal to many boys and girls and have won the respect of librarians and educators. Trust your instincts and your children's judgment as you explore the world of children's literature together. Also, we have many recommended book lists in the library . . . and two knowledgeable staff members here to assist in AR book selections!

Supporting The Leader in Me Initiative

Habit 5: Seek First to Understand, Then to Be Understood (Listen Before You Talk)

Habit 6: Synergize (Together Is Better)

Habit 7: Sharpen the Saw (Balance Feels Best)
